A Cast of Thousands



Aboriginal Community Information Session: What to do if a Child Discloses Abuse

The NSW Joint Child Protection Response Program (JCPRP) and the NSW Health Education Centre Against Violence (ECAV) would like to invite Aboriginal Community members to a 2-day information session on **What to do if a Child Discloses Abuse**. Workers supporting Aboriginal families are also welcome to attend.

JCPRP is a tri-agency program delivered by the NSW Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ), NSW Police Force and NSW Health. JCPRP operates state wide and provides a coordinated safety, criminal justice, and health and wellbeing response to children and young people alleged to have experienced sexual abuse, serious physical abuse and serious neglect.

Facilitators from DCJ, NSW Police Force , NSW Health & ECAV will provide attendees with information to help protect and support a child if a disclosure of abuse is made.

What is child abuse?



What to do if a child tells you about being abused



What does the Joint Child Protection Response Program do?
